Last year was an exciting year for Heathcote: we were awarded funding for our Sixth Form, saw the building rapidly rise and now we are looking forward to moving in to our Sixth Form Centre.

Over the year we were overwhelmed by the encouragement and support of our families as we prepared our Sixth Form Curriculum.

We received over 140 expressions of interest for our Sixth Form. Unfortunately, as it is our first year, we could not offer a full curriculum and some had to be disappointed.

My thanks to Mr McCarney and Mr Bookatz who have worked so hard to achieve our dream of a Sixth Form. We now have 113 students starting their new courses and we wish them good luck.

Last year we ran a pilot Year 12 and we are pleased to report that 100% of our Business Studies students passed their exams (2 with Merits and 2 with Distinction*). 70% of the students taking PE passed their Level 2, most of whom have stayed at Heathcote to continue to Level 3.

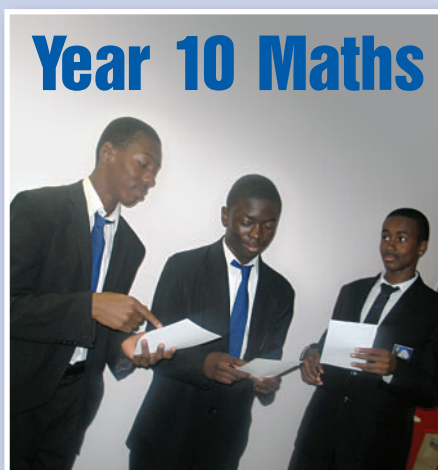

Year 11 Achieve Fabulous Results

Kaur who got 4 A* and 4 A grades, Daisy Whiten who achieved 5A* and 5 A grade equivalents, Emily Townsend who achieved 3A* and 5A grade equivalents, Emma Dixon who had 3A* and 6 A grade results, Lauren Duddell who achieved 2A* and 7A grade results and Henry Wisbey Broom who achieved 5A* and 2 A grades in his results.

Our 5+ A* - C shot up to 80% a rise of 9%.

95% of our students achieved at least a C grade at GCSE.

This year we saw a small dip in our 5+ A* - C including English and Maths, and we are challenging some of the English results.

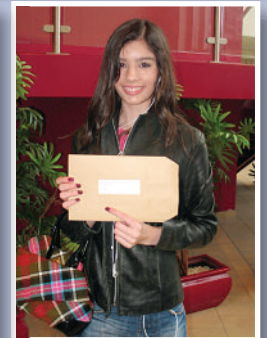
The Science Department, once again, achieved magnificent results. 90% of those taking the exam achieving at least 2 good passes: 100% in Physics, 100% in Biology and 96% in Chemistry. 92% achieved grades in Additional Science and 76% achieved in Core Science.

Our Year 10 students also achieved wonderful results, and 100% of the students entered in Year 10 achieved Maths GCSE.

We want to be the best we can be in this Olympic Year. As Ofsted commented, we know what needs to be done and we have put effective measures to ensure success in the future.
